The community of Red Bluff is invited to this event, and many families attend to place luminaries on the graves of loved ones at the beginning of the Christmas season. This is the time of year when many are especially missing those who have died. Due to pandemic restrictions, this year the Red Bluff High School choir will not sing, and refreshments will not be served. Social distance and facemasks will help keep everyone safe and the event has been approved by the county, meeting all health requirements.

Vacancies, which are open to nominations from the floor include: One Elder, Class of 2023 and one Deacon, class of 2023. To nominate someone "from the floor," you must be an active member of this church. You must first contact the individual you would like to nominate to make sure they are willing to serve. This person must be an active member of this church and meet the basic criteria of service. According to our Book of Order, for a deacon this means being a person of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary life, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion and sound judgment (G-2.0201) and for an elder this means a person of wisdom and maturity of faith, demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit (G2.0301). You may contact Gretchen Sherman or Nicki Carper with your nomination from the floor, and a separate ballot will then be sent out whereby the congregation will vote on your nominee.

What is the difference between elders and deacons?

Diaconal ministry is focused on compassion and service. The Deacons oversee the congregation's witness to the love of Jesus Christ for the poor and lonely, the deprived and oppressed. They organize our ministries of care for the sick and the bereaved, and seek to strengthen the bonds of fellowship and commitment within the church community. They meet the first Tuesday of every month, currently via Zoom.

Elders in service on the Session are the governing body of the congregation. They are charged with ministries of discernment and governance. They are responsible for the life and ministry, the program and staff of the congregation. Ruling Elders establish the budget and set the missional priorities for the congregation's life. Elders meet the third Tuesday of the month, currently via Zoom, and often chair or serve on one additional committee, overseeing a part of our programming.
